GENERAL INFORMATION

EXHIBITION OF JUDO RESEARCH

The European Judo Union (EJU) has invited European researchers to participate in exhibiting their research on the sport of Judo during the European championships and the Judo Festival for the past six years. The objective of this event is to promote Judo research across Europe and to engage European researchers on specific Judo topics. This event endeavors to make information more accessible for Judokas, teachers, coaches and all Judo enthusiasts.

To improve this event, the group of researches in charge of evaluation combined with the Education Commission, a selected panel of judges and the EJU expert group have introduced the Scientific European Symposium on research into Judo.

CALL FOR RESEARCH

Category A

This is the primary category and will receive prize money. Those who wish participate in Category A must select one of the following topics:

NOTE: All research must be based on the 8-12 year old group.

1. Judo for social integration.
2. Observation and teaching analysis.
3. Visual explanation of the fundamental teaching of Judo.
4. New technologies for the development of Judo.
5. Levels of competitions to develop Judo. Important points to note for the specified age group: safety, motivation, decision-making, strength and conditioning, technical ability.
6. Alternative training methods e.g. Cross fit.
7. How to integrate the family into the club.
8. Biomechanics and sports science.
9. Methods of sport analysis for Judo.
10. Motivation.
11. Development of Judo in European schools.

Category B

Category B may include but is not limited to topics relating to the sporting element of Judo; this includes exercise physiology, strength and conditioning, sport psychology, injury rehabilitation, rest and recovery and nutrition. Topics may also include the history of Judo its philosophy, culture or additional values.

Those who will be attending the presentations of research will include EJU Members, University Academics, Judo Coaches and Technical Officials. Researchers need to bear this in mind when presenting their research.

Research for presentation will be considered for inclusion in the program if it is received by the date specified below. The final schedule will include research accepted for presentation.

The European Judo Union is pleased to announce that it will present awards to at least three outstanding researchers based on originality, methodology, quality, clarity, and contribution to Judo.

CONDITIONS OF PARTICIPATION

Any researcher involved in scientific studies of Judo may submit a proposed abstract for consideration. The researches will be selected for display in the European Championship (RUS) April 21-24, IX International Congress of Sport Sciences (ESP) April 21-23, and at the 3rd European Science of Judo Research Symposium & 2nd Scientific and Professional Conference on Judo: “Applicable Research in Judo” to be held in Porec (CRO) during the EJU Judo Festival, June 20-21.

During the Third European Science of Judo Research Symposium at Judo festival in Porec (CRO) the researchers are invited to submit, when possible, results of practical judo research in the Dojo

By submitting the research, participants will give EJU rights to publish their posters on the EJU website and in the poster book.

RULES FOR PARTICIPATION

1. A scientific poster from a University can be presented at the EJU Research Exhibition, covering any discipline connected to Judo teaching and coaching areas.
2. Only authors from EJU countries will be considered for the prize money.
3. Scientific Posters by groups (maximum three authors) with only one author outside EJU countries will be admitted to the competition. The First author must be a member of European Judo Union.
4. Only one poster per author or group will be admitted to the prize competition.
5. If more than one poster is presented by the same author or group, the extra posters will be exhibited outside the competition. (In this case, the author should identify which poster will be exhibited for competition).
6. Every author or Group must submit one abstract summary of 300 words and a PDF copy of the poster for the presentation journal to the EJU Commission.
7. All the participants from EJU countries will be awarded an EJU participation certificate.
8. If the work of a group or researcher outside EJU is worthy of attention the EJU Commission may award them a special distinction diploma.
9. Judges of commission can present Poster (alone or in group with other researchers) but this poster cannot participate to the prize competition.

These participation rules will be published (for the authors' information) on the EJU website before the exhibition.

The Prize money for category A will be awarded to develop future research, or to buy scientific equipment for future research in the Judo knowledge fields. The results of these researches will be published by the education sector on the EJU website.

The Awards for the three winners will be given to the manager of each project:

- 1st place: 1500€
- 2nd place: 1000€
- 3rd place: 500€

All researchers and commission members will receive participation certificates.

In order to be considered, all participating researchers must submit their presentation before:

Poster must follow the following conditions:

Font; Arial or similar style

Title: 85 point

Authors: 56pt

Sub-headings: 36pt

Body text: 24pt

Captions: 18pt

Images minimum of 300 dpi

Portrait layout, 60 cm wide x 80 cm high

NOTE: All participants must use the template* (ppt) which can be downloaded at the following link <https://www.dropbox.com/s/4i7yvomdiytehzh/poster.pptx?dl=0> , for the presentation of the work and send converted to pdf for remains unchanged.

*The researchers can decide which one of the template want to use and can change the space at their specific use. Posters must have overall EJU template vision.

Abstracts should be submitted in English. This will be the official language for all posters. Information must be input directly into the forms provided and sent, by the specified deadline, via email attachment to
